Shelton School is a private, state-chartered, nonprofit, nondenominational day school for children with specific language-learning differences. Shelton is the largest school worldwide serving intelligent students who have a learning difference.

Learning differences include Dyslexia, Dysgraphia, Math Disorder, Written Language Disorder, Attention Deficit/ Hyperactivity Disorder and Speech and Oral Language Disorders.

Approximately 1063 students attend Shelton, grades Pre-K through 12th. 382 students in the Upper School, with 97 in the class of 2023.

5.5 credits (which must include 1.5 credits in Ethics, Sociology, and Psychology), 1 credit in Technology, Computer Applications, Web Design, Coding and Robotics, Creative Digital Media, Advanced Photography, Yearbook, Film III or Broadcast Journalism) and .5 credit Health

Students who are unable to meet the requirements of the recommended plan will graduate on the minimum plan.
