- Primary emphasis is providing children with learning differences (average or above-average intelligence) with a full, effective curriculum through individualized, structured multisensory programs. Learning differences include dyslexia, attention deficit/hyperactivity disorder (ADHD), speech and language disorders, dyscalculia and dysgraphia.
- Collaboration with major medical institutions, including Children's Medical Center Dallas for pediatrician rotations and The University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center Dallas
- A national demonstration, training and referral center for educators, parents, physicians, psychologists, student interns
- Evaluation Center offers full clinical battery of tests to determine specific nature of learning profile. Comprehensive assessment for children and adults
- Speech / Language / Hearing Center offers in-depth speech and language evaluations, screenings, individual and group therapy, staff development for professionals. Provides screenings at 15 other schools.
- Outreach / Training Program includes Scholars Program (Saturdays and summers) for children and adults who need intensive remediation outside the school; extensive teacher training on- and off-campus
- Board of Directors includes 38 leaders from all areas of community life
